CAMBRIDGE BROADBAND TOPS POLL OF UK TECHNOLOGY COMPANIES

Cambridge, UK, 4 October 2004: Cambridge Broadband, the fixed wireless access equipment company, has come top in a nationwide evaluation of technology companies. The Sunday Times Microsoft Tech Track 100 ranks Britain's fastest-growing unquoted technology companies by sales between 2001 and 2003.

Over this period Cambridge Broadband's sales grew 600% per annum to £5.3 million in 2003, compared to the second place company in the poll, whose sales grew by 405%. Cambridge Broadband has sold its VectaStar fixed wireless access equipment to telecommunications operators all over the world, and its customer base includes China Mobile and South African operator Sentech.

Peter Wharton, CEO of Cambridge Broadband, comments: "Over the last four and a half years we have been quietly getting on with our business, developing equipment that enables our customers to offer carrier class wireless communications services. It is not often that the achievements of unquoted companies are recognised in such a public way and we are delighted to come top of the poll."
